Driving Directors to NIC Conference Center:

(from Lincoln Airport)

Head northwest on W Adams Street. Turn right onto NW 12th Street. Continue onto W Cornhusker Highway. Turn right onto US-6 W/N 11th Street. Turn left onto Saunders Avenue. Turn right onto N Antelope Valley Parkway. Turn left onto Transformation Drive.

(from I-80E)

Take exit 409 for US-6 toward Waverly/E Lincoln. Turn left onto US-6 W. Slight left to stay on US-6 W. Turn left onto State Fair Park Drive. Turn right onto Transformation Drive.

(I-80W)

Follow I-80E to W Cornhusker Hwy in Lincoln. Take exit 399 from I-80 E toward Lincoln Airport. Turn left onto W Cornhusker Hwy. Turn right onto US-6 W/N 11th Street. Turn left onto Saunders Ave. Turn right onto N Antelope Valley Parkway. Turn left onto Transformation Drive.

(from I-29N)

Take exit 10 for IA-2 towards Sidney/Nebr City. Turn left onto IA-2 W. Continue onto NE-2 W. Continue straight onto S 10th Street. Use the right 2 lanes to turn slightly right onto N 10th Street. Use the right 2 lanes to turn slightly right onto Salt Creek Roadway. At the traffic circle, take the 2nd exit and stay on Salt Creek Roadway. Turn right onto Transformation Drive.

V. PARKING:

Attendees are encouraged to take advantage of conference busing. Conference buses will depart in 15-minute intervals from 7:15am - 8:30am on 4/13 and 4/14 in front of the Courtyard by Marriott (808 R Street). Conference buses will return to the Courtyard by Marriott (808 R Street) in 15-minute intervals from 6:00pm - 8:00pm on 4/12 and 6:00pm - 8:00pm on 4/13. **Attendees are responsible for getting to 808 R Street for conference bus transportation.**

IX. NIGHTLIFE / DOWNTOWN EATERIES:

Here, a large maki, sashimi, and nigiri menu is complimented by Asian-inspired cold plates, hot plates, entrees, soups, salads, and an extensive sake menu.
 - * **DOZO Sushi** (151 N 8th Street, Suite 100) - a comfortable, friendly, relaxed environment with a wide range of menu items for sushi and non-sushi loves alike.
 - * **Hiro 88** (601 R Street, Suite 100) - Hiro strives to meet the best of both worlds for the Midwestern palate, offering both cooked Asian cuisine and sushi. With one of the largest sake selections, Hiro offers both standard and premium sake flights and servers trained and always available to recommend the appropriate pairing for your meal.
 - * **JTK Cuisine & Cocktails** (201 N 7th Street, Suite 107) - an upscale, fine dining experience with modern plays on contemporary American cuisine paired with an award-winning wine and spirit list to ensure you and your guests have the experience of a lifetime.
 - * **Lazlo's Brewery & Grill** (210 N 7th Street) - a one of a kind, hickory grill where staff prepare Lazlo's signature Burgers, New York Strips by Omaha Steaks, the popular Rainbow Chicken, and fresh seafood. Lazlo's menu features a delicious and unique selection of homemade appetizers, salads, and sandwiches, all complimented with made-from-scratch soups, side dishes, and desserts. The connected Empyrean Brewing Company produces handcrafted beer waiting to be perfectly paired with your individuality and appetite.
 - * **Leadbelly** (301 N 8th Street) - an American pub focusing on high quality and innovative pub food from around the world, including a menu filled with a variety of gourmet burgers, tacos, sandwiches, and salads.
 - * **Mellow Mushroom** (601 R Street, Suite 110) - a funky, art-filled pizzeria featuring craft beer, calzones, and creative stone-baked pizzas.
 - * **Rodizio Grill** (737 P Street) - an outpost of the United State's first Brazilian steakhouse chain offering skewered meats carved tableside and a scrumptious salad bar.
 - * **The Flatwater** (801 R Street, Suite 100) - from the warm and relaxing environment of the dining room and covered patio, to the prepared from scratch menu and their attentive staff, The Flatwater hopes to offer guests a realing experience to rest, regroup, and nourish before continuing their day.
 - * **The Mill** (801 R Street, Suite 100) - a small-batch craft coffee roaster, espresso bar, and teahouse located in Lincoln since 1975.
 - * **The Oven** (201 N 8th Street) - a restaurant specializing in Northern Indian cuisine, known for its rich colors, falvor profiles, and a unique style of cooking in a clay oven, called a Tandoor.
 - * **Vincenzo's** (808 P Street) - Vincenzo's serves delicious salads, pastas, pizzas, seafood, steaks, and Italian entrees. We're sure to serve all of your favorite Italian dishes, like lasagna, ravioli, spicy Italian sausage, shrimp scampi, veal cannelloni, chicken parmigiana, and more.
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
