When making your travel plans, please note that Baton Rouge is in the Central Time Zone.

The Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport (BTR) is the closest airport, followed by the Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport (MSY), located approximately 1hr 15min from Baton Rouge. BTR is serviced by the following airlines that offers nonstop flights from the following cities:

- American Airlines: Dallas/Fort Worth (DFW) and Charlotte (CLT) hubs
- Delta Airlines: Altanta (ATL) hub
- United Airlines: Houston (IAH) hub

BTR is conveniently located just 8 miles (15 minutes) northeast of the Hilton Baton Rouge Capital Center. Driving Directions to Hilton Baton Rouge Capital Center

from Baton Rouge Metropolitan Airport:

Take I-110 South to Laurel Street Exit. Head West towards the Mississippi River. Turn left on Lafayette Street. The hotel is located on the right, 2 blocks down in downtown Baton Rouge. **Distance from Hotel:** 8 mi. **Drive Time:** 12 min. **Typical taxi fare:** \$20 USD

From New Orleans International Airport

Take I-10 West through Baton Rouge and take I-110 North to North Street. Head West towards the Mississippi River. Turn left on Lafayette Street. Go 2 blocks and the hotel is on the right at 201 Lafayette Street.

Distance from Hotel: 70 mi. Drive Time: 1 hr., 15 min. Typical taxi fare: \$100 USD

from I-10E

Take I-10 East through Baton Rouge and exit 155A for LA-30/Nicholson Drive. Keep right, follow signs for LA-30N and merge onto LA-30 W/Nicholson Drive. Turn left onto Government Street. Government Street will veer right and turn into S. River Road. Continue on S. River Road and then turn right onto Florida Street. Turn right at the first cross street onto Lafayette Street. Hotel will be on the right at 201 Lafayette Street.
