

Crossing Sectors, Creating Impact



- 124 UIDP member representatives
- 93% had personally changed career sector
 - 55% corporate/academic relations (connectors)
 - 17% research program leadership
 - 11% tech scout/tech manager

 - Focus on systems and culture move to work for the VP for Research and Economic Development
- Life required job shift away from fundraising; transitioned into corporate relationship management
- Graduated from Auburn University with an M.B.A.

- Moved to HudsonAlpha Institute for Biotechnology
 - Recruitment role, real estate

- Hired in Engineering / Transition to BD / Selected by Division to WINGS Group IV (Harris Corp Gov't Systems)
- Followed Mgmt to smaller business same industry to concentrate on developing new market apps using company core technologies (Griffon Corp)
- Transitioned upstream from Technologies to commercializing IP by patent aggregator (BTG)
- Bus Dev, Market Development, IP led to a role in IP & STA by major A&D Prime Contractor (Northrop Grumman)
 - Transitioned within the company working with the SBIR community
 - Further transition in the company to support CTO with taking Research Positions/Deal making with Academia

- Joined former University Liaison to help build the Business Engagement function (CMU)


